Philosophy of play

Direct approach in use, they rarely create their action with complicated build-up. Often have even two players upfront, feeding them with longer passes. In result, they usually have very low ratio of possession (below 40%) and accuracy of passes (average of 75%). Possibly many players are positioned behind the ball, while after recovery (which rarely happen high up the pitch), they create actions on fast tempo with individual actions or quick passes between attackers. They don't engage many players in actions, so when player with the ball is pressed and they are forced to slow down their actions, still support isn't to likely to arrive. In defence, they try to dense danger zones and create numerical advantage, what should cover their individual shortcomings (below 50% of challenges in the defence is successful)

Chances for the opponent

Individual actions, which can focus attention of more players in one zone should be followed by passes into less overloaded space. It seems the best idea to find gaps in overcrowded Malta's defence. Also crosses straight into the box can be good idea as long as players good in the air play attack. Malta won average of only 38% of aerial duels. Also intensive pressing on unsupported players who receive longer passes should lead to easy recoveries and minimization of danger created by Malta side.

Threats for the opponent

Main problem may be fast creation of attacks. As high number of players may be needed to be engaged in attacking actions, fast passes after recovery aimed on players upfront may create threat as usually only few players remain at the back. Schembri and Briffa seem to be main creative force in attack, distributing the ball during counters (3 and 5 key passes per game respectively). Effiong is main receiver, being usually positioned highest upfront. He looks for individual actions, being as for Malta team, quite successful by them.



Tactics in recent games

3-5-1-1 can be expected. They are supposed to be defensive-mineded and put many players behind the line of the ball and engage only few of them in attacking actions. Wing-backs are in most games positioned deep and aren't too likely to provide width.

Little asymmetry in formation can be visible with Briffa on the pitch, as in most situations he's much more offensive-minded on his flank, supporting Schembri by playing final passes. If attempts of providing width will be attempted by defensiveminded players will be used, right flank should be also preferred. In result visibly more acrions are created there.

Fast build-up

Their average possession ratio is below 40%. They rarely kept the ball for longer periods of time, soon after recovering delivering into attacking zones. All defenders rarely hold possession, when it's possible deliver shorter passes to central midfielders. When they are marked, direct approach is used immediately. In other situations, when ball can be delivered to them, action may be created with shorter passes. Still, rarely the ball is played back under pressure. They prefer to use even risky attacking passes in opponents' half, instead for holding the ball. Still however, they often lose possession before the ball will be send higher up the pitch. Average per game they are losing 23 balls in own half this year (Image 1). When more space is left, finishing depends on individual actions taken by the receiver of the ball. In other situations they may make attempts of fast one-twos, however often it's impossible as usually after direct pass, receiver is unsupported. To avoid losses and counters, relatively often shots are made from difficult positions, just to finish the action

Attacking player upfront

During build-up, they like to have at least one player positioned high up the pitch, who may be receiver of direct passes. He often drops deeper, as passes in many situations aren't played too close to opponents' defensive line. However, when defensive line manage to move with the ball to central zones, he tend to be positioned close to opponents' box, waiting for passes there. If he manage to receive it - finishes immediately (Image 2)


Aiming the ball wide

By creation of attacks, longer balls are often aimed in less covered wide zones. In these situations attacking players try to receive the ball relatively high, often close to opponents' box. Ball may be aimed even behind opponents' full-backs, while Maltese attacking players runs from deep position. Remaining participants in attack move then into box, where they wait passes aimed directly into danger zones (Image 3)


Asymmetry by attacking


Right flank attacks should be preferred. Briffa is much more offensive-minded on his side, while in the left one, players who play there are much more focused on defending. Additionally actions when wing-back join the attack there are possible, what creates more passing options, what created possibility for less direct approach. Still, action there is created very fast, with risky passes (Image 4)

Low number of players participating in counters

During creation of counters when long pass is sent usually only few players move high up the pitch, while the remaining stay deeper. In result, often player who received the ball has to finish action on his own. It cause Malta's counters little dangerous. Only 6% of their counters lead to shots, most of them thanks to right flank attacks (Image 1)

Through passes

With player positioned upfront, when of deeper positioned attackers receive the ball after recovery, he usually immediately looks for through pass. Often they are aimed wide, as chances for receiving the ball there are higher. If it's possible - receiver tries to finish the action on his own. If not, keeps the possession possibly long, giving team-mates time for running into the box (Image 2)

Players in holding role

When longer ball is received in middle zones yet, what doesn't leave much possibilities for finishing, receiver tries to hold the ball as long as support will come. In many situations attacker is the receiver, so he waits for Schembri or Briffa to come with support. When he passes the ball back to them, immediately moves forward, trying to make himself available for through balls (Image 3)














Lack of attempts of higher recovering

They rarely form lines during pressing in middle zones, following more the ball, than trying to cover specified zones. Close to own half, attacker tries to press opponent with the ball and when he has limited passing possibilities thanks to this movement, other midfield players move bit higher, trying to be positioned close to potential receivers. Still, very rarely they cross with their attacks central line of the pitch. Only 7 balls are recovered in opponents' half per game (Image 1)

Deep defensive line

Malta like to use deeper defensive line. They leave then very little space between lines of defence and the midfield, protecting central zones of the pitch. Central midfielders are usually positioned only a bit higher than central defenders. Many players wait already in the box, so it's rather difficult to play with crosses, especially after slow build-up, even despite they aren't too successful in the air. There's usually very little space in front of the area when they form their defensive line, so after recovering, attacks should be created possibly quick (Image 1)

Attacking opponent with the ball by more players

Especially when they have advantage in defence, they like to double their marking on player with the ball, limiting his options in attack. Usually having solid shape in defence, they are able to move two players out of the line, without losing stability in defence. Still, player good at the ball is able to convert focussing on him and look for passes into zones less covered due to attack on him (Image 3)

Clearances after recovery

Being positioned deep, Malta defenders often find themselves under intensive dribbles per game pressure, so no surprise that often after recovering the ball, don't have too many possibilities of playing safer passes. They are forced then to make clearances. However, only few players are positioned upfront, so they aren't usually too accurate and opponents can easily pick up the lost ball. That's why after losing the ball close to Maltese box, attempts of intensive pressing should be taken (Image 4)





Set pieces in attack

Corners

Movement doesn't seem to be intensive, usually the are positioned behind the line of the goal box, while in the ball is aimed, run in the direction of the goal, as cross is usually aimed close to it.


There are no visible patterns in the movement, however possibly one of the players runs in the direction of the short post, as the ball is in most situations aimed there. Still, crosses are often flat, it seems worth to place one player on potential line of it.


Sometimes they short take their crossing, but if they manage to deliver the ball into box, outcomings are similar. Pass is aimed close to the goal, rather sharp. However, as they have problems with passing play, quick pressing after their short-taking may lead to recoveries.




Also movement is rather static, so they have problems with losing marking, especially as crosses aren't too sharp. In most situations the ball is aimed directly on goal, even from wider areas, however rarely strong enough to cause problems for the keeper, if remains untouched.

Sometimes also ball is aimed wider, as receiver tries to send it back into central zones. Still, these passes aren't too sharp and should give enough time for adjusting positioning. In result

























Two players are positioned close in goal box, trying to make clearances of balls aimed there. Other players are positioned close to opponents' however when the ball is aimed, they rather move in the direction of the ball, than follow tightly movement of opponents. In results, by rebound or passes made after crosses, players may be unmarked in the area.




Mixed marking as well. Opponents who are positioned close to the box are manmarked, while spare men try to move in the direction of the place, where the ball is sent. Defenders are focussed to defend primarily front of the goal.
























Justin Haber
34 years
Goalkeeper

Likely to start actions with longer passes, avoiding more riskly solutions by buildup. Still, keeps good accuraccy of his balls. Focused by defending inside own penalty area, rarely looks for actions further from the goal-line.



Ryan Camilleri 27 years Central defender

Isn't too convincing by duels, so in result tries to act close to teammates from defence, making central zones more dense, but leaving space on his side. Bu build-up focused on avoiding losses, plays usually safe passes, clearing the ball under pressure.



Andrei Agius 29 years, Right footed Central defender

Most active from all defenders, trying to recover the ball from opponents with possession or move higher to fight in aerial duel. He's likely to move out of the line for challenge, but still rarely it leaves gaps, as due to narrow play from whole defence, still much space isn't left there.



Jonathan Caruana 29 years Central defender

Most attacking-minded player from defensive trio, likely to move higher both with and without the ball, forcing deeper dropping by one of the defensive midfielers to provide cover for his actions. Still, seem rather easy to block, as defender avoids challenges. May be also used as wing-back, is then much more likely to provide width actively. Still is rather focused on exploit free space than to dribble.



Steven Bezzina 28 years Left defender

Very defensive-minded as wing-back. Also tends to keep little distance to other teammates. Quite successful in duels in the defence, however his low contribution in attacking actions result in the fact, that rarely actions are created there.



Paul Fenech 28 years Defensive midfielder

Deep positioned and defensive-minded. Quite successful by safe passes, however rarely able to aim successful pass into attacking zones. Much more useful by pressing in deep zones, helps by overloading areas where the ball is aimed.



Rowen Muscat
24 years
Defensive midfielder

Often play very deep. If one of the wide central defenders will move higher up the pitch, he's most likely to fill the gap created this way. Also being positioned behind first line of the pressing, join its actions being successful in terms of recoveries.



Steve Borg 27 years Right defender

Much more active on his flank at early stages of build-up than Bezzina. Still, relatively rarely moves high up the pitch, being focussed on his defensive duties. Successful by tackling, effectively closes down opponents close to the by-line and makes attempts of recoveries.



Andre Schembri 29 years Attacking midfielder

Versatile midfielder, quite succesful by attacking actions, able to dribble past single opponent, before aiming pass behind the defence. Often drops deep to provide passing possibility, but still often waits for the ball higher, providing link between defensive and attacker.



Roderick Briffa
34 years
Defensive midfielder

Most attacking-minded from all defensive midfielders, tries to support Schembri by creation of fast attacks. Often drops higher and wider to right flank, creating more space for actions. Quite successful by keeping the ball, able to find places to aim crucial passes, even despite rarely more players are engaged in attacking actions.



Alfred Effiong 30 years Forward

Active by attacking challenges, moves intensively in order to receive the ball from deeper zones and when it happens looks for individual actions finished with shots. However, as usually is unsupported, when doesn't manage to finish own action with shot, in most situations losses the ball.



Zach Muscat 22 years Central defender

Most likely to use risky passes from all central defenders, but still it doesn't result in much higher number of losses in own deep zones. During defending takes active stance, sometimes even supporting line of the pressing, formed by defensive midfielders.



Michael Mifsud 34 years Forward

Alternative in attack, more foused on receiving the ball close to the penalty area and finishing. For this reason rarely support build-up actions and is quite easy to cut him out of the play, especially as isn't too successful in individual actions.



Andrew Cohen 34 years Attacking midfielder

Tends to move higher and wider without the ball, so receives relatively low number of passes. Still, in possession able to exploit wider zones with individual actions followed by deliveries into the danger zones.



Clayton Failla 29 years Left defender

Most attacking-minded option as wing-back, both in terms of individual actions, as well as passing play. Very successful by dribbling attempts, able to move forward with the ball. Still, with risky actions often losses the ball, even in own half.


